From the Deputy Principal - Community and Wellbeing

Welcome to all members of our community to the 2025 school year. In particular, I'd like to extend a warm welcome to new students and families who have joined our community for the first time. It has been wonderful meeting so many of you across the first four weeks.

Parent Welcome Evening

This same spirit of welcome was certainly on display at the Parent Welcome Evening, which was held on Tuesday 4 February. It was wonderful to be able to welcome family members on site and into classrooms to meet teachers, connect with other parents, and establish partnerships in learning and wellbeing. This partnership is critically important and begins with ensuring that lines of communication between the classroom and home are established and sustained.

Attendance at School

Of critical importance at the beginning of any school year is to establish a pattern of regular attendance and punctuality to classes. Research suggests that this is the most significant determinant of learning outcomes.

By definition, habitual absenteeism is missing five or more school days per term, and chronic absenteeism is missing 10 days or more per term. Once our staff see a pattern of habitual absenteeism emerge, parents and caregivers will be contacted to determine what further support can be put in place to support regular school attendance.

As we move towards the middle of Term 1, I'm asking all parents and caregivers to prioritise school attendance and to be proactive in their communication with the College should you be noticing any resistance or school avoidance in your child.

To support families, a text message will be sent each day should your child be marked as an unexplained absence from school.

Keeping Safe: Child Protection Curriculum

The Department for Education Child protection in schools, early childhood education and care services policy states that 'all children and young people in the department's preschools and schools will access the approved child protection curriculum'.

The Keeping Safe: Child Protection Curriculum (KS:CPC) teaches children and young people to recognise abuse, tell a trusted adult, understand what is appropriate and inappropriate touching and ways of keeping themselves safe.

Themes

The curriculum is based on two main themes which are presented through topics and activities.

- Theme 1: We all have the right to be safe
- Theme 2: We can help ourselves to be safe by talking to people we trust.

Focus Areas

The two themes are explored through four Focus Areas, which are examined in growing complexity in accordance with the age of the learners.

- 1. The right to be safe
- 2. Relationships
- 3. Recognising and reporting abuse
- 4. Protective strategies.

The KS:CPC is taught across all year levels and subject areas, with a significant focus in pastoral care curriculum. Should you have any questions about the delivery of the KS:CPC, please contact your child's Homeroom Teacher or Year Level Leader.

Welcome to Our New Academic Year

We have had a fantastic beginning to the new academic year, with staff, students, and families collaborating to smoothly transition from holiday mode back into a productive teaching and learning environment.

I extend a warm welcome to all students and families as we embark on the 2025 academic year. A special welcome goes out to our new community members; I hope you've felt a strong sense of hospitality and belonging during your initial weeks at our College. I also wish that your learning journey at St Francis de Sales College will be both successful and fulfilling.

The start of a new year always brings excitement, renewal and anticipation. Over the past few weeks, I've enjoyed walking around the College, visiting classes, and conversing with students, parents, and colleagues, listening to their aspirations for the year ahead.

It's been wonderful to see students re-engaging with daily school life. Many have shared their enjoyment of the holidays but also their eagerness to return to school to see friends and continue learning. It's heartening to hear students speak so positively about their school, friends, and the collective learning experience, and to witness the welcoming and generous spirit of our College community. Undoubtedly, it has been a successful start to the term.

Teaching and Learning Evolution

At St Francis de Sales College, we are dedicated to offering a comprehensive educational experience that acknowledges the unique learning styles and pathways of each student. 2025 represents another step in our ongoing development of teaching and learning at our College, with new initiatives, new subjects and continued growth of existing programs and opportunities.

2025 - New Timetable

As you many of you would be aware, in 2024 we went through a process of timetable review and renewal. This process has culminated in the implementation of a simpler, more effective, efficient and equitable R-12 timetable structure for our College this year.

New Subject Opportunities

From 2025, our Year 7 students have access to a wider range of elective options. Students will rotate through a range of Arts and Technology subjects (including Dance, Music, Drama, Visual Art and Digital Technology, Food Technology, Materials and CAD) on a term-by-term basis, exposing them to new learning experiences and providing them with the ability to make informed choices about elective subjects they may continue studying into the future.

Subject options for our Senior students continue to expand. Following the introduction of *Earth and Environmental Studies* and *Health and Wellbeing* at Stage 1 last year, we have 15 and 12 students respectively who are continuing these subjects at Stage 2 level this year. We have also introduced *Outdoor Education* at Stage 1 this year and will look to offer this subject at Stage 2 in 2026. We will continue to look at our subject offerings and adapt accordingly to student interest, diverse pathways and increased enrolments.

Vocational Education and Training in 2025

Our Vocational Education and Training (VET) courses are another way in which we provide flexible pathways tailored to individual student needs and interests. For students interested in trade pathways, VET courses offer foundational skills needed for apprenticeships or traineeships. University-bound students can also benefit from VET qualifications, as these courses can help develop industry-relevant skills, provide meaningful employment while studying, and can also contribute positively to ATAR calculations. VET qualifications:

- provide students with the chance to acquire industry-specific skills and knowledge essential for future employment.
- combine practical learning with academic studies to help students make well-informed career choices.

can earn students up to 150 SACE credits at Stage 1 and/or Stage 2.

Interesting St Francis de Sales College VET data for 2025:

- 54 of our Years 10-12 students are completing a VET course, this includes:
 - o 44% of our Year 11s
 - o 22% of our Year 12s
- St Francis students are enrolled in 22 different VET courses, including new courses such as Certificate III in Information
 Technology (Game Development Foundations), Certificate III in Screen and Media (3D Modelling and Animation), Certificate III in Legal Services, Certificate III in Rural Operations (Agriculture), Certificate III in Dance and Advanced Electrotechnology
- 3 of our students are completing school-based apprenticeships in Electrotechnology, Cabinet making and Engineering.

7-12 Academic Assembly

It was with a great sense of pride that we celebrated the successes of our Graduating Class from 2024 and the 2024 Year Level Duces from Years 7-11 at our recent 7-12 Academic Assembly.

The highlight of the assembly was awarding our **2024 St Scholastica College Dux Award** to **Gabriel Cregan.** Gabe studied Chemistry, Physics, Specialist Mathematics, Mathematical Methods, Integrated Learning - Religion and Activating Identities and Futures (AIF). Gabe's focus and diligence in his studies were acknowledged with the achievement of an A+ in AIF, and an outstanding overall ATAR score of 94.40. This achievement is even more impressive given Gabe's role as one of our 2024 College Captains and his considerable swimming commitments outside of school. We wish Gabe well, as he enters the world of university study, with an offer to study a Bachelor of Science (Honours) Enhanced at Flinders University.

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) takes place each year for students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9. This year the NAPLAN tests will be scheduled between Wednesday 12 March and Monday 24 March. Please note that this timeframe allows for catch-up days for students who may miss a test. All tests will be conducted online, with the exception of the Year 3 Writing test. Students will participate in four tests in total in the following domains:

- Writing
- Reading
- · Conventions of Language
- Numeracy

In preparation for NAPLAN tests, students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 will sit a NAPLAN Practice Test on Tuesday 25 February.

The NAPLAN Practice Test is for *practice only* and will provide students with an opportunity to become familiar with the types of questions they will experience in NAPLAN Online 2025. Students, teachers and parents can also use the public demonstration site at any time to become familiar with NAPLAN Online **NAPLAN Public Demonstration Site**.

For those students with a Personalised Plan for Learning (PPL), these are currently under review by our teaching staff. The PPL outlines your young person's assessed needs, educational aspirations, support systems and goals for engaging with learning. Your child's PPLs are reviewed regularly through discussions with students, family feedback, meetings with key College staff and input from allied health professionals and professional reports. Later this term, we will be seeking input from families about your child's PPL for 2025; at this time, you will be able to access your child's PPL via SEQTA Engage under the Reports tab, ensuring you have ongoing access as needed.

So far, I am enjoying it because of the work and all the new machinery that I get to use, the other workers who are always willing to lend a hand and are fun to get along with, but also because I'm able to do something that I have a passion for to help me complete my schooling. I have found that this apprenticeship has a great work environment in which I'm thriving and believe that I'm fitting in well. This opportunity has been great so far and I'm so grateful that I took it".




The theme for this years Appeal is *Unite Against Poverty this Lent*. The Appeal officially begins at the College on Shrove Tuesday, 4 March.
