From the Principal

Thanks to you all for the role you have played in the four week period since our last *Link Up* was published; perhaps the most challenging time for us all during our management of ongoing education through this pandemic. The College deeply appreciates the partnership with families that has enabled us to continue to meet the directives that have been provided to us around operation, communication and staffing. I have no doubt that you understand the challenges that have been presented, but I remain equally confident that we will together work through this phase, as we have the previous, and as we will the future.

In the last month staff have had the first of a series of meetings that will occur this year focused on our *Vision for Learning* priority for 2022 of student agency, voice and leadership. This focus for us as a whole staff has arisen from the feedback we received from students in the Live-Learn-Lead surveys they undertook in the second half of last year. We look forward to both the work staff will together undertake, and engaging our students with how we can operate better in the space of student agency, striving to ensure our students are more connected and have more ownership over their learning journey.

As previously advised, a significant change to our out of class literacy intervention program has occurred with the introduction of the MultiLit suite of programs in 2022. Testing has been undertaken to identify students across Years 1 to 7 requiring additional literacy support and many families will be aware of this through contact made from program coordinator, Emily Lovelock. Some may be aware

that the College has indeed been advertising recently for an additional Education Support Officer to work with Emily to ensure we maximise the success of the intervention for these students across this first year of the program.

We were delighted last week that our Year 7-12 Sports Day was able to occur. As always, the day was characterised by wonderful spirit, competition, support of one another and celebration of performance. I congratulate every student on the way that they contributed to the success of the day, acknowledge all of our highest performers as Age Champions (details of which can be found in the Sports Report), and of course our overall winning houses of the day, with Lyon claiming the Spirit Cup and Savoy being our overall House Champions.

As I write to you today, our Year 3, 5, 7 and 9 students are undertaking their 2022 NAPLAN practice tests in preparation for the real assessments next term. The practice tests are about providing students an opportunity to become familiar with the format for the online tests, and to ensure the College's ICT capacity. I thank all of our students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 for the way they have engaged in this process.

Today also marks the day of the start of our latest building project, the extension of the learning neighbourhoods in Years 1 to 6. We welcome Sarah Constructions as our partners in this process and look forward to delivery of the project by the middle of the year.

I'm pleased to advise the community that Sr Shiji will be taking some time from us, from the end of next week to return to visit her family in India. I know that many of you are very aware of the positive contribution Sister has made to our community since commencing with us in May 2019. Sister is obviously very excited to have this opportunity to return to India for the first time since coming to Australia and be able to reconnect with her family. We wish her every blessing for what will no doubt be a joyous time.

As we head into these final weeks of term, again with some uncertainty that a new State Cabinet may clarify in coming days, I simply wish you and all of your extended family every best wish to stay well, and be well.

For each of us, our resilience is being tested with many things beyond our control. These challenges are compounded by fears of what may lie ahead including health concerns for family members. With such drastic changes to the life that we are most familiar with, concerns for individuals and their wellbeing has reached a zenith.

We live in hope that these tough times will not last for much longer and while our patience is tested, if we can dig further into our reservoir of resolve, every day our resilience is building. We need to be accepting that things cannot and do not always work in our favour. This isn't an easy concept for children and young adults to accept or understand. We actually have to teach kids to be resilient and to believe that tough times don't last but tough people do.

The final weeks of Term 1 will be busy but the joy of Easter, the fresh air of autumn, the quality time spent doing fun activities with family and the cycles of the seasons help us to maintain a rhythm for life. We will get through these tricky times together.

The Learning Curve diaries that our Year 3-12 students have been issued with for 2022 are deliberately chosen for the powerful messages of positivity. Students are challenged to *Create the Type of Life I Want For Myself*. Each week in the diary is underpinned by PERMAH+ principles. These are:

- Positive Emotions + Gratitude
- Engagement + Mindfulness
- Relationships + Empathy
- Meaning + Purpose
- Accomplishment + Optimism
- Health + Strengths

Teachers are using this resource to help students understand their character strengths and respond to the challenges they face with an array of weekly activities.

Another focus on Wellbeing occurs each term when our students complete the *Pulse Check In* administered in Home Group and overseen by Catholic Education SA. The Pulse data gives valuable insights into how well St Francis de Sales students are engaging with their learning and connecting to their school. The data is used to help build an individual profile for each child at the College and helps

maintain the inextricable link between wellbeing and learning. Please feel free to contact the College to learn more about your child's Pulse Data.

"We were ecstatic that we had the opportunity to attend UN Youth's SACON. We learned about various things within this year's topic of international law, that affect not only us, but the world around us. Throughout the weekend we engaged in an interactive learning style that was designed for everyone, no matter the background knowledge you had or your expertise, everyone could participate and learn from the experience.

We had the honour of being in the presence of guest speakers such as Honourable Justice Bleby, Mr Joel Lisk and Ms Juliette McIntyre, who spoke about both international and space law. It was a wonderful opportunity for those interested in law and diplomacy, as well as other components.

We had the opportunity to participate in Interactive Problem Solving (IPS), which was fun! One of the highlights of the event was MUN or Model United Nations. Of course it wasn't just diplomacy. While we definitely strengthened our knowledge on the theme topic, as well as our communication and leadership skills, we grew socially as well. Biology Students visit Cleland Wildlife Park

Our Year 11 Biology students recently visited Cleland Wildlife Park where they learnt about threats to survival of Australia's endemic species and conservation strategies. They learnt about human impact on biodiversity and investigated the interrelated factors of an ecosystem, relationships between organisms and identified keystone species and consequences on ecosystems of their decline.

"Recently we went on an excursion which has furthered our knowledge regarding the survival status of different endemic species in Australia. As a class, we got to listen to an education officer who taught us about the importance of conservation strategies and the role we play in the protection of species. We also got to explore the park, and see, as well as interact, with range of different animals such as dingoes, emus, wombats, echidnas, and Tasmanian devils, which we have been studying in class. This excursion has allowed us to take our knowledge from the classroom, to gain a deeper understanding of ecology, and the interconnection between species and their environment, by having a hands-on experience."
