From the Deputy Principal - Community and Wellbeing

Demonstrating integrity requires understanding humility

Unpacking the Heart Value *Integrity* is an interesting exercise. Being described as a person of integrity is a high compliment indeed. It conjures an image of someone whose conduct is exemplary. They are trustworthy, honest and reliable. Consistent in their response, people of integrity do the hard yards day in and day out, they might complain from time to time but they continue to 'show up' and get on with doing what needs to be done. They also develop a mindset that invokes an understanding of purpose and through this comes a sense of pride in what they do. Intrinsic motivation without overt gratification are qualities of people who demonstrate integrity. This is where humility comes in.

It has been said in education circles that humility is less developed in young people these days. There is speculation that society is to blame for this. Recently, our College staff listened to a keynote address from highly regarded educator, author and counsellor Mark Le Messurier. Mark took us on deep dive into the lives of young people as he sees them and he thinks that many young people today miss out on being taught humility. Parenting styles have changed, many would say for the better but others would argue that values of respect and courtesy have been lost in the transitioning of parents to enabling their children greater agency. Traditionally in Australian culture, humility is often regarded above many other qualities. Having a modest view of your own self-importance is preferred. Nobody takes too kindly to a braggart or show off but in these days of hedonistic social media, attitudes are changing. Perhaps one of the best definitions of humility comes from British writer C.S. Lewis who said True humility is not thinking less of yourself, it is thinking of yourself less. Perhaps Lewis had an eye to the future.

Humility is not one of our College Heart Values but it is inherent in all of them. It is acquired through the processes of observing appropriate responsive behavior, showing gratitude and demonstrating acute awareness of the perspectives of others. It is learnt at home, at school, at work, on the sporting field, on camp, in the queue at Foodland, driving in traffic and in just about every social situation. Our young people at St Francis de Sales are able to acquire humility in and outside of class by learning how to work collaboratively with others. Mark Le Messurier challenged the staff to think about who our wise guides are. The mentors and role models who assist in shaping our morality. Even though she is in India with her family at present, we are blessed to have Sr Shiji as a member of our staff. Her quiet, role modelling of humility is inspirational to all as she observes children's behavior through soft eyes and with a warm heart. At a time when our world needs positive role models, it is timely to consider and invest in humility.



Walk Safely to School Day




We took to the pavement last Friday 20 May to walk safely to the College as part of the National Walk Safely to School Day.

Student Achievements



Gabe Cregan, Year 10, competed at the 2022 Australian Age Swimming Championships held at the SA Aquatic and Leisure Centre as a multi-class swimmer in the new S19 category from 11 to 13 April. He competed against other multiclass swimmers in 10 events and swam personal best times in five of these events.

His results are as follows:

Boys age 15-16 (top 10 finishes):

5th place: 50 and 100 m breaststroke, 100 m backstroke

6th place: 100 butterfly 8th place: 50 butterfly

9th place: 50 backstroke, 100 freestyle

Boys age 15-16:

12th place: 50 m freestyle

Boys age 12-15:

12th place: 200 m individual medley

14th place: 200 m freestyle

This is the first time S19 swimmers have completed at a national level. As the fastest S19 swimmer in many of his events, Gabe has set many state and national records.

Gabe also competed with his teammates in the boys 14-15 years, 4 x 50 medley relay (non multi-class), swimming the breaststroke leg. They finished 35th out of 44 represented clubs, and achieved a SA Country Record, beating the previous long-standing record by 6 seconds.



Congratulations also to our Year 9 student, Leni Newham, for bringing home a silver medal and breaking her own SA state record for the event at the 2022 Swimming Australia Age Championships - well done!



Harry Lovelock, Year 9, represented South Australia in the Under 16 Boys team at the 2022 Softball Australia National Championships held in Blacktown, Sydney. It was the third time Harry has represented SA for Softball since 2019 (due to COVID, the Nationals didn't go ahead in 2021).

SA always finds Queensland and NSW hard to beat, but the boys did a great job again this year.
