

From the Acting Principal

This week marks the end of Semester 1 within the College, and it is amazing to think that we are almost halfway through the academic year. This is a busy period for our staff and students as they finalise assessments in preparation for Semester 1 Reports. Semester 2 brings a change of electives and/or subjects for some of our year levels and students, and this may also result in a change of teacher for some subjects. Our staff are well skilled at supporting students through this period of change and, of course, will be happy to work parents/caregivers through any questions or inquiries you may have leading into Semester 2 programs.

Recent Student Free Day

The recent Student Free Day provided our staff with opportunities to work collaboratively to develop and document curriculum, units of work and individual student adjustments leading into the change of semester at the start of Week 9 this term. We have four student free days each year, which are usually scheduled around the same dates each year. We appreciate that these days can put some pressure on families, however they represent significant professional learning opportunities for our staff and are directly linked to day-to-day teaching and learning programs, and initiatives aimed at improving student learning and wellbeing outcomes. Provision for Student Free Days is part of the Enterprise Agreement (EA) with the Independent Education Union of Australia (IEUA) and these are applied across all schools under the agreement.

NAPLAN Test Trials

St Francis de Sales College was one of approximately 700 schools around Australia to be selected by the Australian Curriculum, Assessment and Reporting Authority (ACARA) to participate in this year's NAPLAN Item Trial. The purpose of the Item Trial is to evaluate potential NAPLAN test questions ('items') for use in future NAPLAN tests. Here at St Francis de Sales some of our Year 7B and 7Y and 9B and 9Y students were engaged in the trial on Wednesday and Thursday of last week. I would like to acknowledge and thank the students and staff involved, especially since it was only a short time ago that they were involved in their 2023 NAPLAN Tests. I am sure they will gain satisfaction from the understanding that the results from the trial will help ACARA ensure that future NAPLAN tests are valid, reliable and fair for all students.

Congratulations

Year 11 student **Gabriel Cregan** has been in Vichy, France representing Australia at the 6th Virtus Global Games. The games featured swimmers from a wide range of countries including USA, Egypt, Italy, Denmark, Czech Republic, New Zealand, Columbia, France, Iceland, Israel and Australia. Gabe shouldered a very heavy workload throughout the games, competing in six individual and six relay teams during five days of competition. Gabe had an outstanding swim meet, winning individual gold medals in the 50m, 100m and 200m Breaststroke and the 400m Individual Medley (including a personal best) and team gold in the 4x 100m Men's Medley and the 4x 100m Mixed Medley events. Gabe's magnificent efforts have seen him returning home with 6 gold, 3 silver and 1 bronze medals. This medal haul makes him the most decorated athlete on the Australian Swim Team. This type of success at an International level only comes about as a result of a huge amount of training and commitment. There is little doubt Gabe has had to demonstrate great resilience and persistence to achieve so well at this level and we congratulate him whole heartedly on his success.

Curriculum and Co-curricular Opportunities

I recently attended the Semester 1 Dance production *Welcome to my Nightmare* which was the spectacular culmination of the work our Dance students from Year 8, 9, 10, 11 and 12, and extra-curricular groups Dance Minis, Dance Crew and Dance Squad have been engaged with throughout this semester. All up, there were approximately 160 students involved and their love of performing and their enthusiastic engagement with the dance choreography was clearly evident through each dance sequence. The production was performed to Junior and Middle School classes last week, as well as two 'sold out' crowds of parent/caregivers and friends. Special thanks to the students involved for their passion and commitment to the College's Dance program. I would also like to acknowledge our College staff (Peta Bojanic, Aleks Bojanic, Michele McDonald and Karen Boswell) and current and past students Tayla Ward, Harry Baxter, Max Maher, Kaitlyn Richards and Kyla Martins without whom the Dance program and this performance would not have been possible.

An enormous range of Knockout Sport competitions have been held throughout this term, and I congratulate all students involved for the way they have represented the College in all of these activities. I also wish to acknowledge and thank those staff who volunteer their time to coach, manage and coordinate our Knockout Sport teams, under the coordination of Nadia Honner. Without the generosity of spirit of these staff and their willingness to step up and put in the time and effort involved, these learning opportunities would not be available for our students.

Coming up on 5 July, our students and staff will sleep rough for the night to raise important funds and awareness for the most vulnerable people in our local community through the St Vincent de Paul Sleepout. From the APRIM

Play life to the full!

I recently attended a funeral of the father of a close friend of mine. They are a Muslim family and therefore the ceremony and burial took place at a Mosque and the cemetery adjacent to it. Being a Catholic I was unaware of the specific rituals, symbols, and expectations of the ceremony, but felt that it was important that I was present for my close friend. I stood at the back of the Mosque just observing the short prayer service. Three rows of men stood shoulder to shoulder facing the front of the mosque, reciting prayers and occasionally getting on the floor to bow down as part of their ritual. I didn't understand the significance of the prayers and ritual being displayed before me, but had a great sense of its importance to the families gathered at the Mosque. I wasn't connected to the ritual.

On reflecting upon this, I naturally pondered the importance of life itself, and making time for relationships and loved ones. However, the contrast that I experienced at the Muslim ceremony to a Catholic Mass or liturgy caused me to ponder the rituals and symbols that have meaning for us as Catholics. What makes them so important to us?! What is it that our Catholic rituals, symbols, prayers, and liturgical celebrations do to assist us to do and 'be' as followers of Jesus? My ponderings then led me to a quote that I had read by Pope Francis, which speaks of our call to live life to the full and be our best selves for others and our natural world.

"... Take the memories you have inherited, look towards the horizon and today, grasp life and carry it forward, use it productively, make it fruitful. God calls you to be fruitful! God calls you to transmit this life to others. God calls you to create hope. God calls you to receive mercy and show mercy to others. God calls you to be happy. Do not be afraid! Do not be afraid. Play life to the full! That is life." (Pope Francis - Message to young people of Brownsville, Texas, July 27, 2016)

This message is especially relevant to the students who recently celebrated their Sacrament of Confirmation and Holy Communion. During the recent long weekend, the students involved in the year long Sacramental Program, celebrated their Sacraments of Confirmation and Holy Communion at our Parish Mass Centres. 7-12 Highlights

Stage 1 and 2 Physics Excursion

On Thursday 1 June, our Stage 1 and 2 Physics students made their way, via public bus, to The University of Adelaide to participate in a workshop with OzGrav. OzGrav are a network of Australian universities who all contribute to discovering more about gravitational waves, which were only first discovered in 2015. The researchers and scientists at The University of Adelaide contribute to this global enterprise by experimenting with and developing new laser technology, which can be applied to a global network of gravitational wave observatories, of which there are three, with another under construction.

The students participated in testing a scaled back replica of the gravitational wave observatories, using interference patterns to measure the wavelength of lasers. They also went on a guided tour of some of the OzGrav laboratories and saw firsthand some of the experimental set-ups used to test laser propagation through fiber optics. Students were also able to make use of the OzGrav virtual reality goggles, where they were able to fully immerse themselves (virtually) in a variety of cosmological events that can be measured using gravitational waves, such as the colliding of two black holes, and discussing how this relates to laws of Physics studied in school, such as Newton's Universal Law of Gravitation.

After our workshop, the students were able to make the most of the uni's cafes for lunch, before heading back to the College on the T840. An interesting, rewarding and productive day was had by all, thanks to all the students for their full participation and excellent behaviour, and to Jane Hosking for accompanying the group.

A common misconception surrounding children playing outdoors in the rain is that it will cause illness. Studies show however quite the contrary. A healthy child's immune system will actually protect them from colds, no matter the weather. Exposure to rain and muddy play may in fact help to strengthen your child's immune system and the diversity of healthy bacteria in the body.

At Alive, most days in each of the learning spaces we don our wet weather gear and head out in search of muddy puddles. Most important of all though is that playing outside in the mud and rain is just so much fun, and that of course is the most important work our little learners have to do while spending time at Alive.
